


Becoming a Disciple of Jesus "Listening to Jesus" January 21, 2024

Asking Jesus to Heal People:





Asking for Special Privileges:





Asking Jesus, "Do You Care?"





The Disciples Tried to Warn Jesus 2 Times:




The Disciples Tried to Warn Jesus 2 Times:




"Then Peter answered and said to Him, "Explain this parable to us." Matthew 15:15 (NKJV)






2. Ask Jesus Questions Yourself:



"Then Jesus said to His disciples, "Assuredly, I say to you that it is hard for a rich man to enter the kingdom of heaven. 24 And again I say to you, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God." 25 When His disciples heard it, they were greatly astonished, saying, "Who then can be saved?"



26 But Jesus looked at them and said to them, "With men this is impossible, but with God all things are possible." 27 Then Peter answered and said to Him, "See, we have left all and followed You. Therefore what shall we have?" Matthew 19:23-27 (NKJV)

3. Wait For His Response:
