



 A lion with eagle wings. The wings were plucked off. It was lifted up from the ground and made to stand like a man. The mind of a man was given to it.


 A bear raised up on one side. It had 3 ribs in its mouth. It was told to "Arise, devour much flesh."


 A leopard with 4 wings of a bird on its back. It had 4 heads and dominion was given to it.

 A terrifying beast. It was different from the others; dreadful and exceedingly strong. It had iron teeth, bronze claws, and 10 horns. It devoured, broke in pieces and stamped what was left with its feet.

 A little horn came up among the 10 horns, before which 3 of the 10 were plucked up by the roots. The little horn had eyes of a man and a mouth speaking great things.

 A ram with 2 horns, one higher than the other. He charged to the west, to the north and to the south.

 A goat came from the west across the face of the whole earth, without touching the ground. And he had a notable horn between his eyes. The goat trampled the ram. Later, his horn was broken and in its place came up 4 other horns toward the 4 winds of heaven.

 A little horn came up from one of the 4 horns. It grew exceedingly great toward the south, toward the east, and toward the glorious land.



3rd Vision of a Little Horn that Grew Great:

“And out of one of them came a little horn which grew exceedingly great toward the south, toward the east, and toward the Glorious Land. 10 And it grew up to the host of heaven; and it cast down some of the host and some of the stars to the ground, and trampled them.



11 He even exalted himself as high as the Prince of the host; and by him the daily sacrifices were taken away, and the place of His sanctuary was cast down.



12 Because of transgression, an army was given over to the horn to oppose the daily sacrifices; and he cast truth down to the ground. He did all this and prospered.”

2. Understand the 70 Weeks of 7:

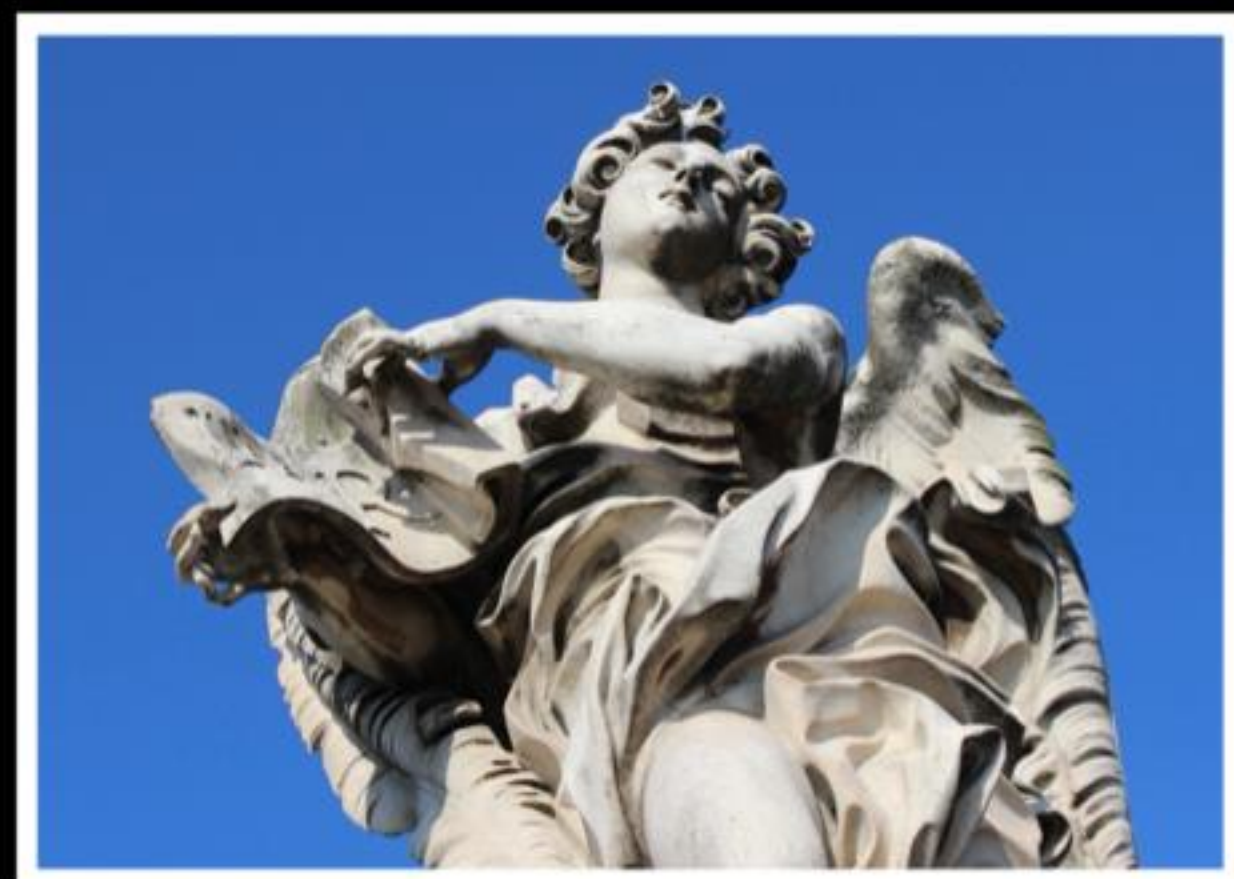


“24 “Seventy ‘sevens’ are decreed for your people and your holy city to finish transgression, to put an end to sin, to atone for wickedness, to bring in everlasting righteousness, to seal up vision and prophecy and to anoint the Most Holy Place.” Daniel 9:24 (NIV)



“25 Know and understand this: From the time the word goes out to restore and rebuild Jerusalem until the Anointed One, the ruler, comes, there will be seven ‘sevens,’ and sixty-two ‘sevens.’ It will be rebuilt with streets and a trench, but in times of trouble.”

Daniel 9:25 (NIV)



“26 After the sixty-two ‘sevens,’ the Anointed One will be put to death and will have nothing.

The people of the ruler who will come will destroy the city and the sanctuary. The end will come like a flood: War will continue until the end, and desolations have been decreed.”

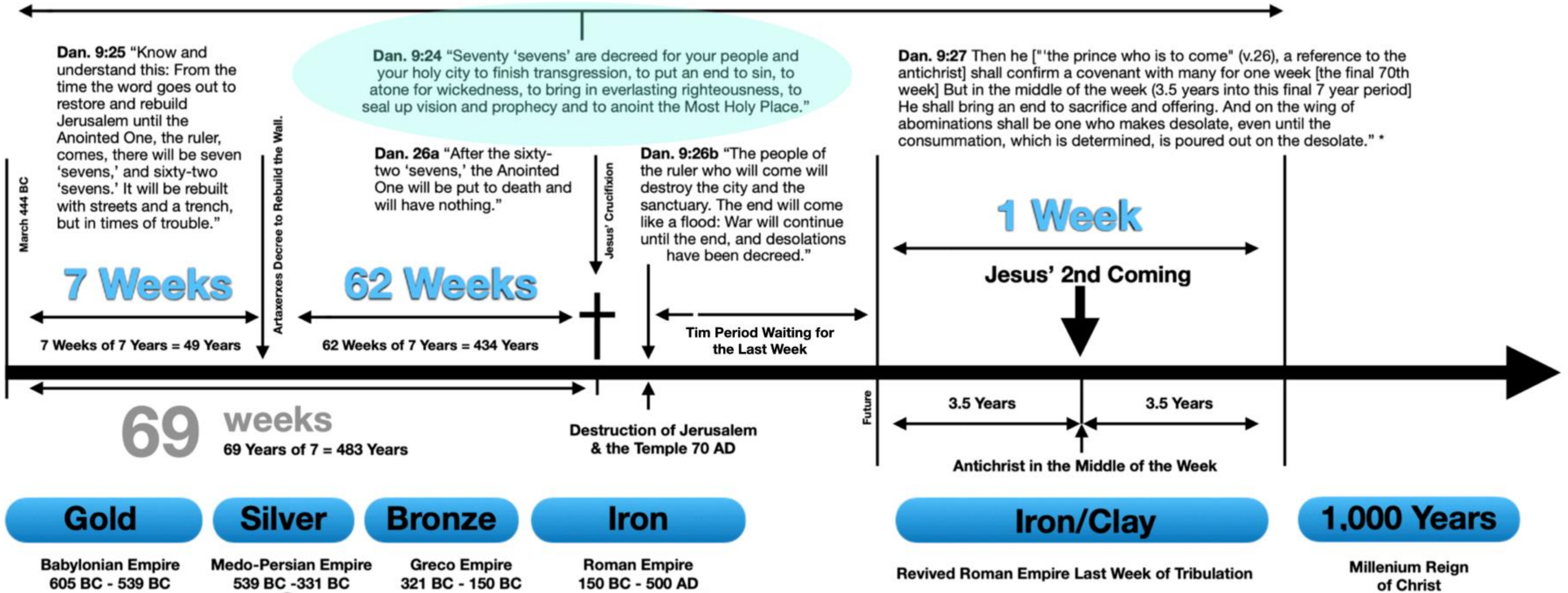

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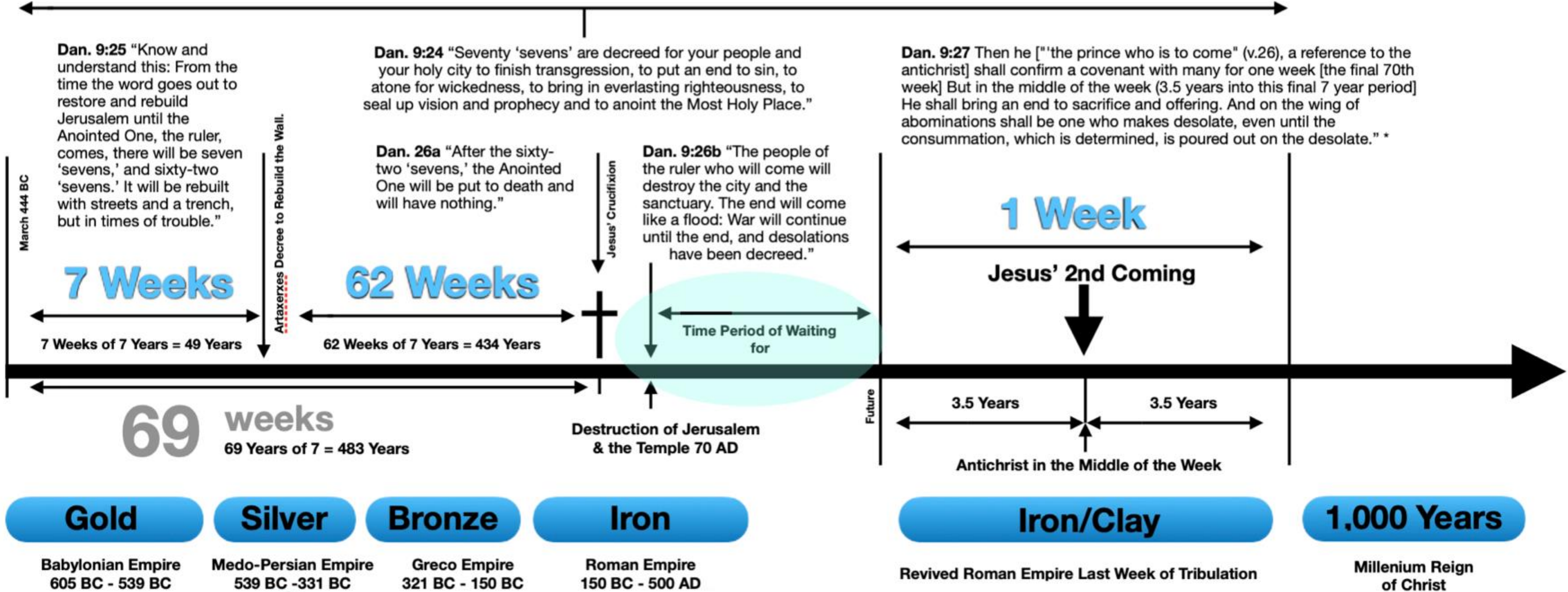

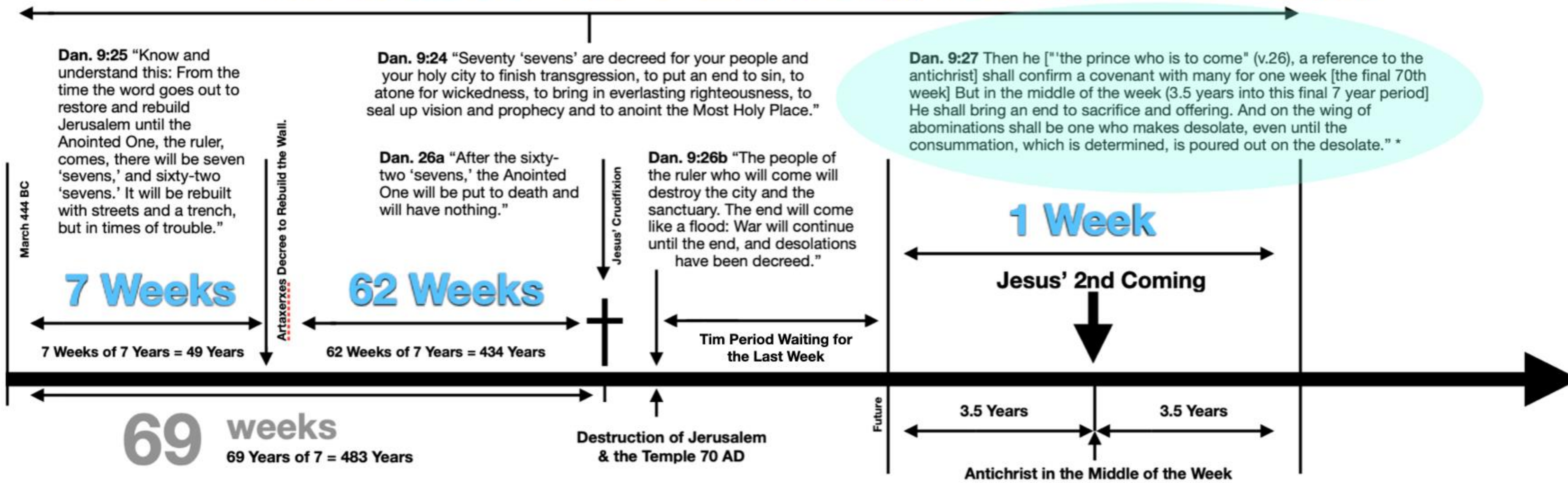


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Mid-Tribulation View of Eschatology from Daniel 9:24-27 (NIV)

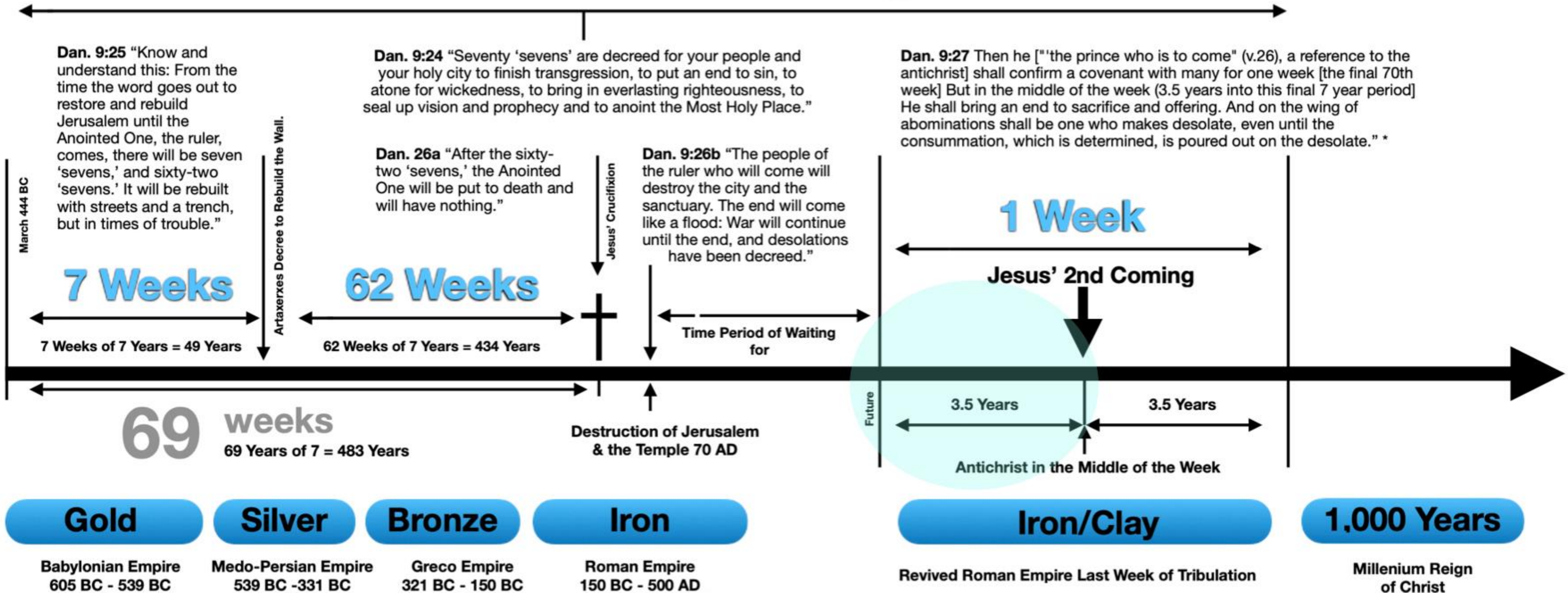
