

Frankincense: the dried sap of Boswellia tree



Myrrh: the lifeblood of Commiphora tree

Frankincense & myrrh are both tree resins/balms/gums, or gummy sap that oozes from the bark of two different trees native to the Arabian Peninsula and Northeast Africa.

Incisions, cuts or openings are made in the bark of the tree during important times of year, and the sap pours out.

Myrrh - Suffering and death of Christ (suffering servant)

...Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh.

Purposes of Myrrh in biblical times:

- Perfume (Psalm 45:8; Prov. 7:7; Song of Sol. 1:13; 3:6; 4:6, 14; 5:1, 5, 13)
- Anointing oil/incense (Exodus 30:23-25)
- Cosmetics (Esther 2:12)
- Antiseptic, anaesthetic/painkilling (Mark 15: 23)
- Embalming for burial (John 19:39)



Myrrh - Suffering and death of Christ (suffering servant)

Anaesthetic/painkilling

• Then they brought him to the place called Golgotha, which is translated, the place of Skull. Then they gave him wine mingled with myrrh to drink but He did not take it.

Myrrh - Suffering and death of Christ (suffering servant)

Embalming for burial

• And Nicodemus, who at first came to Jesus by night, also came bringing a mixture of **myrrh** and aloes, about a hundred pounds. Then they took the body of Jesus and bound it in strips of linen with the **spices**, as the custom of the Jews is to bury.

John 19:39-







The Suffering Servant

Who has believed our report? And to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed? For He shall grow up before Him as a tender plant, And as a root out of dry ground. He has no form or comeliness; And when we see Him, There is no beauty that we should desire Him. He is despised and rejected by men, A Man of sorrows and acquainted with grief. And we hid, as it were, our faces from Him; He was despised, and we did not esteem Him. Surely He has borne our griefs And carried our sorrows; Yet we esteemed Him stricken, Smitten by God, and afflicted. But He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities; The chastisement for our peace was upon Him, And by His stripes we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; We have turned, every one, to his own way; And the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all.

He shall see the labor of His soul, and be satisfied. By His knowledge My righteous Servant shall justify many, For He shall bear their iniquities.

Our Sacrificial Lamb

God presented Christ as a **sacrifice of atonement**, through the shedding of his blood—to be **received by faith**. He did this to demonstrate his righteousness, because in his forbearance he had left the sins committed beforehand unpunished.

But God demonstrates His own love towards us, in that while were still sinners, Christ died for us.

For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.

2 Cor 5:21

And the gift is not like that which came through the one who sinned. For the judgement which came from one offense resulted in condemnation, but the free gift which came from many offences resulted in justification. For if by the one man's offense death reigned through the one, much more those who receive abundance of grace and the gift of righteousness will reign in life through the One, Jesus Christ. 3. Invitation to fix our eyes on him

For we do not have a High Priest who is unable to sympathize and understand our weaknesses and temptations, but One who has been tempted [knowing exactly how it feels to be human] in every respect as we are, yet without [committing any] sin. Therefore let us [with privilege] approach the throne of grace [that is, the throne of God's gracious favor] with confidence and without fear, so that we may receive mercy [for our failures] and find [His amazing] grace to help in time of need [an appropriate blessing, coming just at the right moment].

Hebrew 4:15-16 (Amp)

Casting all your care upon Him for He cares for you.

Myrrh: the lifeblood of Commiphora tree

Incisions or **cuts** are made in the bark of the tree and the sap pours out-"you must **injure** the tree without killing it". Frankincense and Myrrh have proven medicinal properties (antiseptic and anti-inflammatory properties, cure for many ailments).

"But he was **pierced** for our transgressions; he was **crushed** for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed"- Isaiah 53:5(ESV)
