


An ideal Analogy



John 7:37-39 (ESV)

On the last day of the feast, the great day, Jesus stood up and cried out, "If anyone thirsts, let him come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, 'Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water." Now this he said about the Spirit, whom those who believed in him were to receive, for as yet the Spirit had not been given, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

Direction of Flow







The Peace Equation



a+(b+c)=(a+b)+c

PwG + PwS + PwO = x

Where

PwG: Peace with God

PwS: Peace with Self

PwO: Peace with Others

x: value from 0 to 1

The Peace Equation

P(G + S + O) = x

Where

P: Peace

G: God

S: Self

O: Others

x: value between 0 and 1

The Peace Equation

When X is zero

$$P(G + S + O) = 0$$

When X is 1

$$P(G + S + O) = 1$$

1 Corinthians 12:12&13 (NET)

For just as the body is **one** and yet has many members, and all the members of the body—though many—are **one** body, so too is Christ. For in **one** Spirit we were all baptized into **one** body. Whether Jews or Greeks or slaves or free, we were all made to drink of the **one** Spirit.

Psalm 133 (NET)

Look! How good and how pleasant it is when brothers truly live in unity. It is like fine oil poured on the head, which flows down the beard-Aaron's beard, and then flows down his garments. It is like the dew of Hermon, which flows down upon the hills of Zion. Indeed, that is where the Lord has decreed a blessing will be available—eternal life.

Galatians 5 (ESV)

13-15

For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another. For the whole law is fulfilled in one word: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." But if you bite and devour one another, watch out that you are not consumed by one another.

25&26

If we live by the Spirit, let us also keep in step with the Spirit. Let us not become **conceited**, **provoking** one another, **envying** one another.

Mark 3:24&25 (ESV)

If a kingdom is **divided** against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. And if a house is **divided** against itself, that house will not be able to stand.

Example of the Early Church

Acts 2:1, 44-47 (NIV)

When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place.

All the believers were **together** and had everything in common. They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. Every day they continued to **meet together** in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and **ate together** with **glad** and **sincere hearts**, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

Truth

Therefore, having put away falsehood, let each one of you **speak the truth** with his neighbor, for we are members one of another. Ephesians 4:25 (ESV)



Fairness

Now in those days, when the disciples were growing in number, a **complaint** arose on the part of the Greek-speaking Jews against the native Hebraic Jews, because their widows were being overlooked in the daily distribution of food.

Acts 6:1 (NET)

Dos and Don'ts

- 1. Do not backbite or slander
- 2. Listen to both sides
- 3. Seek Reconciliation/Forgiveness
- 4. Develop conflict-resolution skills
- 5. Temperance (control your anger)
- 6. Avoid unnecessary arguments/fights
- 7. Don't give destructive criticism
- 8. Don't discriminate
- 9. Give Honour and Respect
- 10. Celebrate what is good.
