




# This is King Solomon Speaking:


"I have come into my garden, my sister, my bride; I have gathered my myrrh with my spice. I have eaten my honeycomb and my honey; I have drunk my wine and my milk." Song 5:1 (NIV)

## The Shulamite Speaking:

"I slept but my heart was awake. Listen! My lover is knocking: "Open to me, my sister, my darling, my dove, my flawless one. My head is drenched with dew, my hair with the dampness of the night." [3] I have taken off my robe -- must I put it on again? I have washed my feet -must I soil them again?" ... "I opened for my lover, but my lover had left; he was gone. My heart sank at his departure. I looked for him but did not find him. I called him but he did not answer." Song 5:2-3,6 (NIV)




"I charge you, O daughters of Jerusalem, if you find my beloved, that you tell him I am lovesick!"


### The Daughters of Jerusalem:






- 24 Times She declares the beauty of her man.

- 70 Plus Times in a book of Wisdom!




